Safeguarding is the responsibility of all staff members and through our training we ensure any signs of abuse or neglect are identified early and appropriate action is taken. This role is vital in keeping our pupils safe and ensuring their needs are met promptly.

As parents and guardians, you play a key role in safeguarding your children. Here are some ways you can help:

- **Stay Informed**: Familiarise yourself with our safeguarding policies and procedures. You can find these on our school website or request a copy from the school office.
- Open Communication: Encourage open and honest communication with your child. Let them know they can talk to you about anything that makes them feel uncomfortable or
- Recognize Signs: Be aware of the signs of abuse or neglect. Unexplained changes in behaviour, fear of going to school, or physical signs of harm are indicators that something may be
- Report Concerns: If you notice any concerning signs or behaviours, please report them to me immediately. Early intervention can make a significant difference.
- Promote Online Safety: Monitor your child's online activities and teach them about internet safety. Encourage them to speak up if they encounter anything inappropriate online.


